





DIRECTIONS to St John's Episcopal Church Hall, Union St, Greenock

BY TRAIN

Trains regular from Glasgow Central to Greenock West (c. £7.10 return)

08.26 arriving Greenock West 08.58

08.40 arriving Greenock West 09.27

09.06 arriving Greenock West 09.39

09.08 arriving Greenock West 09.52

09.25 arriving Greenock West 09.57

From Edinburgh (via Glasgow Central, c. £22.30)

07.15 arriving Greenock West 09.27

To get to St John's from the Station on foot, turn right into Inverkip Street, right into Newton Street, right into Nelson Street, turn left onto Union Street. This will take about 15 minutes to walk.

BY CAR

Follow M8 to Greenock, following A8 through town (many roundabouts) and onto A770, left onto Robertson Street and right into Union St, Greenock, Inverclyde, PA16 8JJ, UK.
